## “FLAUNT IT” – Signature Cocktails

Php 350

PRINCESS MACAPUNO - rum,tequila, calamansi juice, macapuno balls  
Named after a local princess who died of a broken heart

ROYAL GREEN - tequila, basil, cucumber, lemon juice  
Basil is also known as L'herbe royal; in Greek basileus is "king"

BUENA VISTA- rum, mango nectar, triple sec, calamansi, young ginger  
The mother town of Guimaras (Philippines' mango island), “buena vista” means  
"good view" in Spanish

KAHEL - tequila, dark rum, triple sec, dalandan juice  
Kahel or "green mandarin“ is Spanish for our native orange

BARAKO MILLIONAIRE- brandy, rum, black coffee,condensed milk  
Men made it rich back in the day from the Batangas coffee trade; Barako also  
Means "stud"

## "FAKE IT"- Signature Mocktails

Php 200

MADRE DE PINA - pineapple juice, coconut cream, honey

This pina colada is guilt-free as madre also means "nun"

LA TRINIDAD – strawberry juice, grenadine, sprite

This cool valley just outside Baguio is famous for strawberry fields and fond summer holidays

HACIENDERA - dalandan juice, calamansi juice, pomelo juice

From Spanish "hacienda" meaning estate or plantation, this lass is wealthy but provincial – a faux cosmopolitan

MARIA CLARA- banana, strawberry puree, coco cream

This smoothie is sweet and creamy, just like the fair skinned mestiza heroine of Rizal

""LITTLE SUCKS" "- Chupitos

BONITA - lambanog, orange juice, honey  
For the island beauty with Blonde Ambitions

MAESTRO - rum, amaretto, red bull  
For the rock star

MESTIZA - rum, coconut milk, kahlua  
For your dream girl

MORENA - lambanog, papaya, banana, calamansi  
For the proudly dark skinned Filipina

SUAVE - rum, campari, orange juice  
For the cheesy guy with strong cologne and ridiculous come-ons

MESTIZO - lambanog, pineapple juice, caramel syrup  
For the actors and athletes who are half Filipino and half European

## "To All The Girls I've Loved Before" - MARGARITAS

Php 300

IMELDA - tequila, triple sec, ginger juice

Alluding to Imelda Marcos who loved to sing: ginger tea or "salabat" is a common prescription for a sore throat

FRIDA - tequila, triple sec, lemon juice, avocado, tabasco

Inspired by the Mexican surrealist painter Frida Kahlo who had a volatile marriage with the famous artist Diego Rivera

MIEL - tequila, pineapple juice, honey

The French and Old Spanish translation of the term of endearment "honey"

JAPONESA - tequila, triple sec, midori, melon

A tribute to the Japanese migration to Mexico or the "Pacific Exchange"

## “SHAKEN AND STIRRED” - Martinis

Php 300

MAKISIG - vodka, gin, watermelon, lime juice, apple juice

Some say watermelons may increase libido much like desirable men; makisig means dashing

ADAM-vodka, apple juice, passion fruit juice

Girls with an "Adam's apple" are boys! Biblical "Fall of Man"

DIEGO - tequila, vermouth, lemon juice, tabasco, olive

The Filipino revolutionary Silang or the Mexican artist Rivera were both “fiery”

PAPASAN - sake, coconut rum, mango puree, sprite

Colloquial for sugar daddy; opposite of "Mamasan" or pimp

KING KONG - rum, bailey's, crème de banane

It was beauty that killed the beast when Kong climbed the Empire State to protect Ann



MOJITOS – from “Mojadito” or “a little wet”

JINX- white rum, brandy, grape juice, mint, lime

The beautiful Halle Berry famously drinks a mojito in “Die Another Day”

CLASICO -rum, mint, lime, brown sugar, soda

Needs no explanation

EL DRAQUE - gin, mint, lime, lemonade, kiwi, cucumber

The English pirate Richard Drake or the “dragon” used Aguardiente, a primitive version of rum, to create the first mojito in Havana

MOJO- vodka, mango puree, sugar cane juice, calamansi

The African sugar cane workers in Cuba knew how to cast a spell
